Introduction

This Workshop aims to foster the adoption of Open Science, Citizen Science and Open Research paradigms in the Cultural Heritage domain and Lexicography.

The workshop will be divided into two parts. The theoretical part of the workshop will be framed by a short overview on the conceptual embedding of lexicography into the framework of (European) research infrastructures, the vision of Open Science Commons (shared by the contributors of the proposal) and – last but not least – the technical backbone of the infrastructures.

In a second – practical – part we will explore with the participants the challenges of Citizen Lexicography and the possibilities of the Science gateway on the example of interlinking language data and cultural data with respect to their own data. The following concepts are chosen for hands on session and interlinking: 1) bread and cookies, 2) colours and 3) common names for living organisms.

Main aims of the Workshop:

- Introducing Grid and Cloud Infrastructures and their accessibility to A&H researchers in an easy way
- Introducing the new DARIAH CC Science Gateway as well as introducing several EGI services that might be relevant for A&H researchers
- Introducing Citizen Lexicography
- Evaluation and User feedback on the existing tools
- Hands-on on the infrastructures: Bring your own questions/materials to test!
- Losing the fear of Grid and Cloud instead of exploring them!
- Living interdisciplinary collaboration

- Introduction into Open Science Methods, Research infrastructures and Citizen Science
- Hands-on session to learn about the infrastructures
- Hands-on session to establish a citizen lexicography pilot in a pan-European framework and embed your own data into this
- Guide participants to connect with and make use of research infrastructures
